



Identity Part 4 – Hello I am a Servant of God

Text: John 13:1-17 & 35, Hebrews 10:24-25, Romans 12:2, Luke 6:31, Ephesians 5:1

Topic: Identity, Child of God, Community, Being Different, Getting Messy, Servanthood

Overall Point: You are a Servant of God

Challenge: Whose Feet do you need to wash?

Discussion Questions:

1. Growing up, who taught you how to act?
2. **Read John 13:1-4a.** Jesus was in community around the dinner table. Kyle said, “As a Child of God we need community.”
 - a. What does true community look like?
3. **Read John 13:3-5.** Jesus does something different by washing the Disciples feet. Kyle said, “As a Child of God we are to be different.”
 - a. **Romans 12:2** says, “Do not be conformed to this world...” How are Christians supposed to differ from the world?
4. Jesus continues to wash the disciples’ feet even when Peter doesn’t want him to. (**John 13:6-11**) Jesus teaches us that “As a child of God we cannot stop.” We cannot stop loving and serving Him and others.
 - a. Why is it sometimes easier to stop serving others and stop sharing the Gospel?
 - b. Jesus doesn’t stop and even washed Judas, the traitor, feet. What does this look like for us in following Jesus’ example?
5. Jesus, who is Lord, washed Messy Feet! Kyle said, “As a child of God we need to get Messy.”
 - a. How are people “messy?”
 - b. How can we practically “get messy” as Christians?
6. **Read John 13:14-17.** Jesus gives an example of how, as children of God, we are to act. We are to be Servants of God.
 - a. Is being a servant of God easy or difficult, why?
 - b. How does being a Servant of God show others who Jesus is?
